General Tracey was married in 1853 to Miss Hermine, daughter of Colonel Duchesne, of Montreal, Canada.

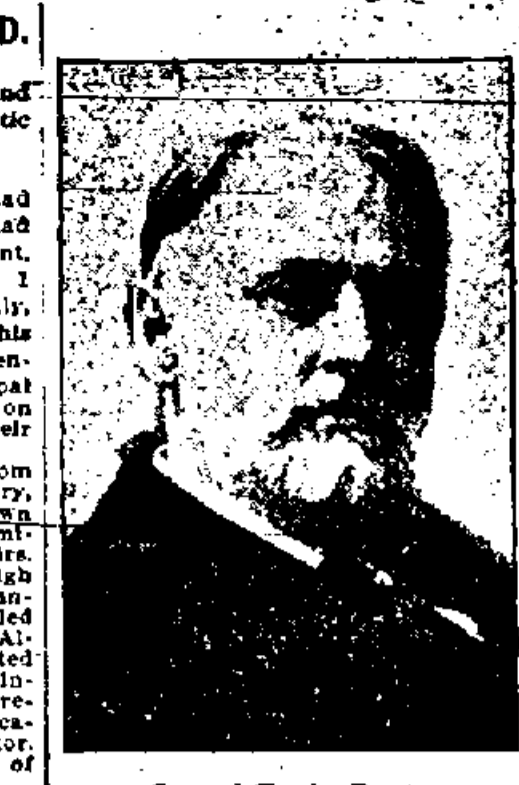
