during her natural life she paying thereout the interest
of the sum of four hundred pounds wherewith the same is
Charged by mortgage to Mr. Thomas Pass of Bridgworth a
aforesaid Cheese Factor and my Will is that the said sum
of four hundred pounds shall continue a charge upon the
said Estate during the life of my said wife and which
devise to her I do hereby declare to be in full and
satisfaction for the Bond or Engagement I entered into
previous to our marriage for serving to her for her life
a annuity of twenty pounds a year in case she survived
me And from and immediately after the decease of my
said wife I give and devise my said Estate at Slipley
unto the said Thomas Pass and Edward Thorne of Alkettall
in the said County Gentleman and their heirs upon trust
that they the said Thomas Pass and Edward Thorne or
the survivor of them or the heirs or assigns of such a
survivor do and shall sell and dispose of the said Estate
to the best purchaser or purchasers and for the most
money that can be got for the same And upon further
trust to pay and apply the money arising by such a
Sale (after discharging the said mortgage for four hundred
pounds and interest as follows) that it to say to the
aid Thomas Pass and Sarah his wife the sum of four
hundred pounds to be paid and applied to and for the
use of their daughters in such manner as they or the
survivor of them shall by deed or will direct and in de-
fault thereof to be equally divided between them to
Mr. John Marston of Birmingham Brasffour and Ann
his wife the like sum of four hundred pounds to be paid
and applied to and for the use of their daughters in
