On the 24<sup>th</sup> December 1611  
with the will annexed of the

administration was granted of all and singular  
the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said testatrix  
having been first sworn (by Commission) duly sworn  
to administer.

 will I have set my hand and seal the first day  
 of November in the year of our Lord one thousand  
 seven hundred and thirty five and in the thirty  
 sixth year of the reign of his Majesty King Charles  
 the first our Great Brittain of England  
 signed sealed published and  
 delivered in the presence of W. Browell  
 of the same parish
